OBJECTIVES	The objectives of the courses are to allow attendants to get more familiar with ballistics, or to get more specialized in a certain domain of ballistics. During <u>the first week</u> , called "Introduction to Ballistics", we focus on presenting the fundamental scientific principles of internal, external and terminal ballistics. We present the laws and models used today, and the ideas are demonstrated on computer or during demonstration tests in the laboratory. "Applications in Ballistics" is the title of <u>the second week</u> . This course is more focused on practical applications. We shall visualize and measure the variables that characterize the ballistic phenomena. Wound ballistics and forensics are two topics that will also be presented. More information can be provided on demand.
